CONSTITUTION: Copies of the By-Laws were handed out to each table. Some changes have been made.

Our mini-grant committee was happy to give a total of \$2,230 to eight teachers in November! We only had about one third of the applicants we had last year, and all seemed quite worthwhile, so we were able to fund every teacher who applied. The amount given varied from \$210 to \$270, with most receiving \$250. We had our first application from the Cecil County School of Technology. Since 2019, we have given \$6,330 to 32 teachers.
