CCRSPA MINUTES – February 18, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 11:20. Some committee members gave reports.

OUTREACH: Paula extended thank-yous for donations to schools. New items will be delivered to school nurses after spring break. Barbara Buck was inducted into the Senior Citizen Hall of Fame for her volunteerism, service to her community, attention to our homeless, and her donation of time to her church. We will be needing new nominations for this position in April.

CONSUMER ED: The state sends out information at regular intervals.

LEGISLATION: Shirley Hicks, recipient of the Legacy Award, gave an informative report about the 37th Martin Luther King Awards Banquet. The Legislative committee met virtually for a workshop on Tuesday, January 28th. The purpose of the workshop was to cover some budget issues, provide an update on the Pension System, and to share an overview of legislative priorities. One item discussed was the budget deficit. Previously there had been a surplus. That was due to federal funds that were related to COVID, and they had to be spent. That resulted in a deficit. Social Security was discussed. Maryland teachers are not affected by cuts. Also discussed was pension, legislative priorities, and points of interest. NRTA works with AARP concerning prescription affordability, adult protective and long- time care.

Linda Elwood said the bills were supported. Check the website for details. Nursing homes are not being inspected regularly, and cuts are being made. Contact delegates regarding cuts to budgets in counties. See our website, "Legislative Bills" for more information.

MEMBERSHIP: Sherry Lewis said that we have 252 members, including three new members. Because Maryland is an expensive state, we are losing members. We were reminded that it doesn't matter where you live, your pension comes from Maryland since that is where you worked. For that reason, it is wise to join our organization.

NOMINATING: Some of the positions have been filled and will take effect over the next few months. Recording secretary will be taken over by Cheryl Lee. Joan Marie Parker will be our new corresponding secretary. Filling the positions of co-treasurers will be Anne and Paul Humphrey. Bill Ide has already taken over publications. Thank-you to all who have volunteered for these positions. We are still in need of members to fill the jobs of co-president elect, or president elect. The president's job was described by Kay DeStefano.

SCHOLARSHIP: There was information scattered around on each table. The number of applicants has been dropping. There will be two to three scholarships offered this spring. Fluorescent colored fliers were left on tables in hope that members of our group would display them throughout the county. This will inform possible applicants of scholarships being offered.

SUNSHINE: Betty Moore has been hospitalized in Christiana.

TRAVEL: Fred Metzger discussed the next trip, which is a cruise to Bermuda. The cruise line is Bermuda Liberty, which has the capacity for 2900 passengers. This unfortunately will be the travel agency's last trip, as it is closing next year.

OTHER ITEMS OF INTEREST:

- Our Farm Museum is in desperate need of bathrooms to be used for class trips. Donations are needed.
- The annual business meeting will be held in Ellicott City on May 6, 2025. There is a need for delegates.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS & MINI GRANTS

Each year our organization has the privilege of helping future teachers reach their goals by awarding scholarships. We started this program in 1987, and as of 2025, there have been 60 recipients for a total of \$53,950.

This year we are giving \$1,500 each to two young men. Connor Suprik is a graduate of RSHS who will be a senior at Salisbury, majoring in Physical Education and Health. Daniel Tserkis, a PVHS graduate, will be a senior at Towson, majoring in secondary education. Both have been invited to our May luncheon.

We started giving grants to teachers in 2019. This fall we gave 9 grants. As of now, we have awarded grants to 32 teachers, totaling \$6,330. Teachers provide displays for us to share with you. Come to the May luncheon and see what we have helped them to do with their students this year!

SERVICE PROJECT

We are continuing our support of CCPS students by helping the nurses have needed supplies on hand in their school health rooms. Thank you to everyone for your generous donations to the Kids Fund.

7 NIGHT BERMUDA CRUISE - June 14-21, 2026

I have arranged group space sailing on Celebrity Silhouette out of Cape Liberty Cruise Port, NJ on June 14, 2026, to Bermuda. We have 16 veranda staterooms, Category V2. Each stateroom total cost (2 passengers) is \$4,163.56 which includes basic wifi and classic beverage package. Other category staterooms can also be booked, such as ocean view or inside. I would need to price those out for you upon request. Passports must be valid 6 months past June 21, 2026. A deposit of \$250 per person is due at the time of booking. Travel protection (\$149 pp) and gratuities (\$126 pp) can be added when making the booking.



Once booked, you can set up payments with me whenever you like. Final payment will be due prior to March 15, 2026. The last date to make a booking in the group will be February 14, 2026.

I will be arranging bus transfers to/from the cruising port as it gets closer to sailing. You can also drive the 2½ hour trip yourself and park there. The booking form is attached on the next page. If you have any questions, please send an email or give me a call.
