CCRSPA MINUTES – May 20, 2025

Our meeting was called to order at 11:20 by President Mary Ellen Butkiewicz. The CHALKBOARD was accepted and ok'd.

OUTREACH: Paula said requests from school nurses come in September, January, and March. The requests continue to be for snacks, waters, and clothing. The schools are very grateful.

NOMINATIONS: Mary McCleary was nominated for the Hall of Fame. Kathy Mullen received Honorable Mention for volunteerism. Congratulations to both!

MEMBERSHIP: There has been some turnover with people leaving, while others join. We currently have 249 full members and 24 local only members.

PUBLIC RELATIONS: Members are still being asked to receive The Chalkboard on line, if at all possible. It is on our website. Obituaries will also be posted on the website. Apparently, some non-members have been receiving the publication. A notice has been sent to them from Bill Ide.

Debbie Chance from the State Department inducted new officers who were present. Anne and Paul Humphrey will be our new co-treasurers. Outgoing officers were thanked with very thoughtful cards and gift cards.

GRANTS: Our grant program was started in 2019. Grants of \$100-\$200 were given to teacher applicants. This fall we gave 9 grants. Seven were for \$250.00, one was for \$210.00, and one for \$270.00. Over the years we have awarded grants to 32 teachers, totalling \$6,330. Displays of their ideas were shown at our luncheon. They were very impressive.

SCHOLARSHIPS: The scholarship program began in 1987. As of 2025, there have been 60 scholarships rewarded for a total of \$53,950. This year we are pleased to give \$1500 each to two young men, Daniel Tserkis and Connor Suprik.

TRAVEL: Fred spoke briefly about a planned trip to Bermuda in September. It will be a three-day trip on Celebrity, and the final cruise with Hill Travel.

Our meeting concluded at 12:00.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS & TEACHER MINI GRANTS

In late September, we will be offering grants of up to \$300 each to CCPS teachers for something they want to do with their classes that requires extra funding. Since 2019, we have awarded \$6,330 to 32 teachers. Our recipients have been from all grade levels and disciplines, including English, ELA, chemistry, science, G&T, media, guidance, art, PE, AVID, STEM academy, math and career readiness, and the nursing department at CCST. We are hoping to award at least 8 grants this year.

Applications are to be submitted by Thursday, October 30, 2025. Winners will be notified by Friday, November 7th and will receive their checks the following week.

7 NIGHT BERMUDA CRUISE

June 14-21, 2026

I have arranged group space sailing on Celebrity Silhouette out of Cape Liberty Cruise Port, NJ on June 14, 2026, to Bermuda. We have 16 veranda staterooms, Category V2. Each stateroom total cost (2 passengers) is \$4,163.56 which includes basic Wi-Fi and classic beverage package. Other category staterooms can also be booked, such as ocean view or inside. I would need to price those out for you upon request. Passports must be valid 6 months past June 21, 2026.



A deposit of \$250 per person is due at the time of booking. Travel protection (\$149 pp) and gratuities (\$126 pp) can be added when making the booking. Once booked, you can set up payments with me whenever you like. Final payment will be due prior to March 15, 2026. The last date to make a booking in the group will be February 14, 2026.

I will be arranging bus transfers to/from the cruising port as it gets closer to sailing. You can also drive the 2½ hour trip yourself and park there. If you have any questions, please send an email or give me a call.
